State Coordinator's Message – 2009 OL Utah Annual Report

Another year has passed and OL Utah has finished its annual report. While it is somewhat difficult to assemble all of the information that is needed for the annual report, the report provides good information for us to evaluate what happened in 2009. Table 1 shows the highway-rail grade crossing and trespass incidents for both the United States and Utah. Utah's rank in 2009 for highway-rail grade crossing incidents was tied for 15th best and for trespass incidents Utah was 7th best. We are consistently in the best 15 states most every year. The statistics below does not include TRAX light-rail data, but does include FrontRunner commuter rail numbers for Utah.
