As you all know, Operation Lifesaver was started in 1972 in Idaho by two Union Pacific Railroad employees. Now Operation Lifesaver is found in 49 states, the District of Columbia, Canada, Mexico, and several European countries. The Operation Lifesaver program in Utah was started in 1976. We are celebrating 30 years of sharing our safety message with the residents of Utah. There are many people that have contributed to the Operation Lifesaver program in Utah. However, there is one that I would like to take a moment to single out – his name is Jerry Hardesty.

Jerry Hardesty has worked for the Union Pacific Railroad for 25 years and has served as Manager of Public Safety for the Western United States for 12 years. He has served on 12 Operation Lifesaver Boards of Directors and his territory has covered as many as 12 states. His territory now is five states including Utah. He is a presenter, presenter trainer, regional trainer and serves on the National Operation Lifesaver Program Development Council. There he chairs the Education and Training Committee. Jerry helped create the Operation Lifesaver Utah Board of Directors in 1995 and has served as Chair of the Board since its creation – nearly 12 years. Jerry has mentored several state coordinators (including me) and has trained countless presenters. It would be very difficult to measure and list everything that Jerry has done for our program in Utah and Nationally.
